### **C**OMPETITION **F**ORMAT

- Everyone must be registered to JUDO CANADA in order to attend the event.
  - As this is an introduction event NO PENALTIES WILL BE GIVEN for any age or weight category for beginner levels. Advanced levels all regular rules will apply to matches
  - The Pre-Judo matches, ages ~5-7, will compete against a family member (ne waza only) and will not take part in the regular competition (some expecptions may apply)
  - Beginner level Ne-Waza only an ippon will not end a match, this is to ensure that
    everyone gets lots of mat time. The first ippon of the match determines the winner.
    Matches may be stopped if one competitor repeatedly scores an ippon (ie 3 or more) in a
    short period of time.
  - Beginner level Te-Waza only The first ippon of the match determines the winner. Two Wazari will be awarded an Ippon.
  - In the case of an ippon the contestants will return to the starting positions before the contest is resumed. Winner will be announced at the end of the match.
  - Children's matches will be 2 min and the teen/adult beginner divisions will be 3 min matches. The referee may extend a match if no score at end of match up to 5 minutes. If no winner or there is a tie at the end of 5 minutes, referees and/or coaches will decide with a vote based on performance and skills demonstrated.
  - Divisions will be created to put similar age and sizes together depending on the number of registrants
  - Matches may be stopped early due to referee discretion (ie injury, or unmatched skill level)
  - Athletes may compete in new-waza only, Tachi-waza only or both
  - All arm bars, chokes and makikomi are forbidden in this tournament

Rules may be changed by the tournament director to meet the skills and abilities of the participants in terms of safety as they see fit prior to or during the competition.

#### MEDAL CEREMONY

Medals will be awarded to all participants after each block is completed. A podium will be placed for photos.
